

## FINDING CITATIONS IN DATABASE ARTICLES

### FOR YOUR REFERENCE LIST

Some of the databases provide formatted citations. You can select APA format, which is used by your instructors. Look for the following information when you are viewing the articles in these databases:

- In the **Gale Virtual Reference Library**, the *Citation Tool* is located in the grey bar at the top of the article entry. Click the button next to APA, “Save,” then “Open”.
- In **eBrary**, the elements of the citation appear under the table of contents. The APA citation for this e-book can be the same as it would for a printed book. The citation also appears at the bottom of the page when you print or download a page. Note: First change the setting to APA in “my settings”
- In **Lexis/Nexis**, Click on the icon of a book (for export bibliographic references) at the top right side of the page displaying the article. Under “Export type”: click on “display bibliographic information in a new window”. Next to Style, use the down arrow to switch from MLA to APA. Then click “Export”.
- In **OVID**’s e-books: the Professional Guide to Diseases or the Lippincott Manual of Nursing Practice, the citation information is available under “copyright statement” on the top left side of the screen
- In **ProQuest**, use the “cite” tool at the top of the screen when you are viewing an article.
- In **STAT!Ref** click on “Download Citation” at the top of the page displaying the article
